



Helping NeuroAIDS research



Dr. Cysique and colleagues at the University of New South Wales / St. Vincent's Hospital are conducting a study to better understand whether HIV infection may cause increase risk for developing memory and attentional difficulties in middle-aged persons.

To better understand this issue and help HIV research, HIV-negative healthy volunteers research participants are needed aged 45 and above.

What does the study involve?

2 visits at 18 months interval

Each visit consists of neuropsychological testing of attention, memory, visuo-spatial and language functions as well as mood and well being questionnaires (2 hours)

A head MRI scan (involves lying quietly in the MRI scanner for 45 minutes).

Your participation will help develop standard guidelines to understand cognitive difficulties in HIV infection.
