

### **What is zPass?**

zPass is a more secure password system that is being introduced to all staff and students at UNSW.

It will be used for logging onto PCs and a range of web-based applications.

It will start to replace Unipass for a number of UNSW IT services in 2009.

It will use the same User ID as your Unipass (ie: z1234567).

### **How do I set my zPass?**

You can manage both your Unipass and your zPass through the UNSW Identity Manager:

You can log into the Identity Manager website with your Unipass and set your zPass. Why don't you do that right now?

### **Where will I use it?**

You will need to use your User ID and zPass to log into any of the PCs in the Medicine Teaching Labs. (Wallace Wurth G2/G4 , 106, 107, 108, 110, M210, 202/204; Samuels Museum G05 and Samuels Student PCs on level 3). **PLEASE NOTE** some labs are still being updated. Signs have been posted in the labs that are now using zPass. If zPass is not yet available please use the 'medstudent' login.

If you have classes in any of these rooms you will need a zPass so please set it now. The medstudent account is no longer valid (unless the lab is still being updated - see note above).

There will be other enhanced services coming online during 2009 that will also use zPass.

You should treat your zPass as confidential.

Please configure your zPass before turning up for class as this will make the teaching sessions more efficient. A copy of this email can be found on the faculty website and inside eMed for confirmation.
